

## Computing & PE

- Learn basic Basketball skills.
- Develop running, jumping and throwing.
- Develop catching in isolation and in combination through games.
- Perform dances using simple movement patterns.
- Develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance through Gymnastics.
- Further improve mouse and keyboard manipulation and explore the use of drawing and paint tools.
- Learn to use technology safely and identify where to go for help and support.
- Creating, formatting and editing text on a Word document.

## Maths

- Using "Jim and the beanstalk" by Raymond Briggs as a starting point to explore measuring: Compare length, weight and capacity.
- Making playdough: learning about standard units: centimetre, metre, kilogram and litre.
- Money: Coin collections, adding, subtracting and giving change .
- Understanding concept of Multiplication as repeated addition and concept of Division: as grouping and dividing equally
- Practising times tables 1x,2x,3x,4x,5x,10x
- Continue exploring single and two-step word problems
- Data Handling: Selecting relationships, display and interpretation, Carroll diagrams.
- Fractions: Halves and quarters Make shapes out of Playdough and divide into 2 and 4 equal parts
  - Shape: Symmetry and 2D shapes, understanding 3D shapes.

## Music & Drama

- Read "Little Bear's Little Boat" and act out story together with costumes and props.
- Read "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" and make puppet show of the story.
- Read "Jack and the Beanstalk" together and create a modern version of story together.
- Singing Expression-Learn songs about:
  - Baby animals,
  - Jack and the Beanstalk, - Jim and the Beanstalk.

## English

- Using a twist on the traditional story of Jack and the beanstalk: "Jim and the beanstalk" by Raymond Briggs, to explore literacy activities such as answering comprehension questions, writing a Bean diary, letter writing and story sequencing.
- Exploring grammar: comparing adjectives relating to Jack and Jim and the giant. Learning about punctuation when writing and reading out loud.
- Reading fluency and comprehension through topic related texts such as "The Sunflower Garden" by J.Udry and Little Bear's Little Boat by E. Bunting)
- Writing about growing up: How I changed from a baby to now.
- Learning the names for baby animals
- Continue practice and revision of sounds (phase 3, 4 and 5)
- Continue to develop our writing skills through weekly spelling and cursive handwriting practice.

## Topic

- Plant a bean, plant a sunflower: Using the story "Jim and the beanstalk" by Raymond Briggs and "The Sunflower Garden" by J. Udry as a starting point to explore germination, plant growth stages and learn about parts of a plant.
- Learn about baby animals and their names.
- Minibeasts: Life cycles and Metamorphosis. Butterflies and Silk moths: observe the silkworms in our class.
- Growing up. My body- Changes. How I changed from a baby to now: present some photographs and write about your personal story.
- Learn about Charles Darwin.
